Start of new 4-H club year

If your child is in a 4-H club or plans to join a local club, enrollment forms must be completed annually. This includes the member enrollment, health history and code of conduct. Katelyn Knabe was recognized recently as Powhatan County's Outstanding 4-H Member for the 2009-2010 club year. The 17-year-old Powhatan High School senior has been a member of Powhatan Riders 4-H Equestrian Club for the past six years. Powhatan Riders club leader Melissa Clayton said, "Through the years, Katelyn has grown and matured into a role model 4-H senior member. She has participated in community service events, club fun events, exhibits and leadership." Katelyn participated in the County

4-H Contest in March with a presentation on poisonous plants. She earned a blue ribbon for this presentation and went onto compete at the district level bringing home a second blue ribbon. She qualified for the District and State 4-H Horse Show the past two years. This year, her equine artwork also won third place at the State 4-H Horse Show. Katelyn entered

Next summer's camp is August 1-5, 2011


